

Greetings «Manager_Contact»,

The Puget Sound Emergency Radio Network (PSERN) Project is reaching out to you because earlier this year we confirmed that in relation to the 2022 emergency radio system transition, you are the point of contact for the public safety DAS (Distributed Antenna System) compliance of the following property:

PSERN is the vital emergency radio communications system which will replace the current system used by fire fighters, law enforcement, and other government response efforts in our community to support public safety. The King County Fire Chiefs Association and the PSERN Project mailed all DAS properties on record an [official notice](#) announcing that the upcoming transition will require properties to take action to remain compliant with the fire code. Attached is an overview of DAS transition information. This message is to remind you of the actions you need to take, so that first responders can communicate in your property when responding to an emergency.

ACTION ITEMS FOR DAS COMPLIANCE WITH PSERN:

- If you have not done so already, contract a [DAS Vendor](#) as soon as possible to:
 - Assess your current DAS equipment and configuration.
 - Perform updates to meet the PSERN requirements.
 - Provide instructions and demonstrate to your Building Engineer how to temporarily disable your DAS in the event it is causing interference with PSERN.
- Disable your DAS on the transition date* provided to your property by the PSERN Project.
- Sign a [Rebroadcast Agreement](#).
- After transition, work with DAS Vendor to meet PSERN performance requirements.

**The transition to PSERN will occur in geographic waves across King County when the new system is ready. Properties will be notified 60 days prior as to the exact date they need to disable their DAS. It is estimated that properties in Seattle will need to disable their DAS on a date in early April 2022, followed by properties south of I-90 in July 2022 and properties north of I-90 in September 2022.*
